72. Aberdeen (Port Blair)	Derived from similar name in U.K.
73. Merk Bay (Rangat Tah)	W.R.H. Merk, Chief Commissioner (1904-06).
74. Mahabir Nagar (S/A)	Mahabir Singh IAS, Chief Commissioner (1962-64).
75. Bird Line (S/A)	A.G. Bird, Secretary to the Chief Commissioner at the time of Japanese occupation in 1942.
76. Kishori Nagar (N/A)	Derived from Casurina Bay in the West coast.
77. Sastri Nagar (G/N)	Former Prime Minister Lal Bahadur Shastri.
78. Little Andaman (The Southern most of the Andaman group of Islands)	Original Onge name "Ego-Belony" called Little Andaman in contrast to Great Andamans (Comprising of North, Middle, South, Baratang & Rutland).
79. Tylerabad (S/A)	Named after Col. Tyler.
80. Dugnabad (Port Blair)	An under officer in the Cellular Jail Mr. Duggon who had a really kind heart and tried his best to act up to his conscience in all cases that came up to him.
81. Quarry Hills (Port Blair)	Stones used to be quarried here in the earlier days during British rule.
82. Mazar Pahard (Port Blair)	Derived from the location of the Mazar which is highly regarded by all.
83. Land Fall Island (N/A)	The northern most island "Landfall"
